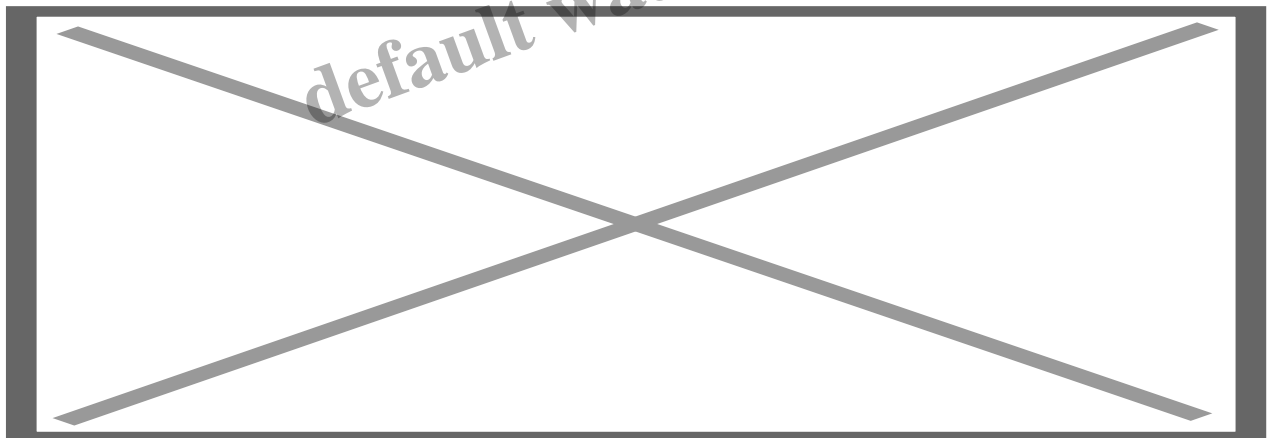




Learn 5 Tips for Choosing a Satellite Internet Service
